HOW TO VISIT US SAFELY!

We are thrilled to be open to the public once again! Like other organizations, we have some guidelines in place to adapt to COVID-19. At this time, we do not require masks but encourage their use in our space. We will happily arrange appointments for immunocompromised or at-risk people to visit the gallery outside our public hours. Please call 306-522-5940.

Please adhere to the following guidelines when you visit us

- Sanitize your hands upon entering the building.
- Travel through the Neil Balkwill Civic Arts Centre halls is onedirection only. Look for and follow directional arrows.
- Enter and exit the building through doors designated for these purposes only.
- Maintain a 2-meter (6-foot) distance from other patrons and staff at all times, unless they are part of your social bubble.
- Masks are not mandatory, but we recommend that individuals provide their own masks for use when safe physical distancing is not possible.
- Do not enter the AGR office or touch desks or workstations.

For membership renewals:

Notify AGR staff from a safe distance (marked with blue tape on the floor) and wait at the white counter under the bulletin board. AGR Staff will deliver a membership form, a pen and a debit pin pad to you. We cannot accept cash.

In tech-heavy contemporary Canada, traditional knowledge and lore may seem outdated and a relic of older days.. However, looking at both social movements and lifestyle trends, it is apparent that new generations are showing an interest in the traditions of their lands and their ancestors.

The recent resurgence in marginalized peoples reclaiming traditional knowledge and a rise in witchcraft practitioners attest to a desire to use folk practices and natural cycles to define our place and identity. New practitioners of old tradition engage with it in a socially conscious mode, seeking connections to their ancestors, heritage and meaningful connections to the lands we live on and the places inhabited by our ancestors.

Nic Wilson: Pavilion of Shadows

The Pavilion of Shadows is an ever-expanding database of mourning and decay. Marble, ashes, celebrity death merchandise, and photographs of distant galaxies create analogies, both personal and public, to the finite nature of bodies. Though many of the histories, anecdotes, and objects that make up this database are drawn from communal experiences, this work is seated in a particular body and subject-position. Wilson draws on their own embodied experiences and observations to wade through histories of life, death, and the distance between these two states.

For the next two months, anyone with a smartphone will be able to screen *Moving Pictures*, a program of short video artworks by Saskatchewan artists curated by Sandee Moore for The Art Gallery of Regina (AGR) using a free app to activate posters located in public spaces throughout Regina and across the province.

Playing the videos is as simple as finding a poster, and viewing through a smartphone camera with the free Artivive app open. This project responds to the urgent need for programming that does not require people to gather in enclosed spaces.

Moore has programmed video works from artists many communities throughout Saskatchewan and adjoining treaty territories to paint a complex portrait of Saskatchewan, its land and its people and their languages and their experiences. *Moving Pictures* features film and video artworks by Theo Pelmus with Kristin Snowbird, Ian Campbell and Heidi Phillips, Graeme Patterson, Lindsay Arnold and Dennis Jackson.

Katherine Boyer: Where the Sky Carries The Sun

Through distance and closure, there is the potential to become closer: closer to artist's processes, research and the experiences that inform their work. The Art Gallery of Regina, in partnership with AKA Artist-Run (Saskatoon), invites Katherine Boyer's intimate glimpse's online sketchbook. Boyer explores quieted, liminal spaces where elements meet as metaphorically conducive to understanding the fluidity of personal and cultural identity through family archives.

Boyer's research and artmaking labour spans (and bridges) textiles, carpentry and horizon lines. Boyer harnesses architecture to begin unravelling what we know and how we know it. The Art Gallery of Regina rescheduled Boyer's solo exhibition in our main gallery, Where the Sky Carries the Sun, for 2022.

Natural Dye & Felting with Melanie Monique Rose

SEPTEMBER 19 & 20, 2020 IN-PERSON \$90 PER DAY/ \$165 FOR BOTH DAYS




This workshop introduces participants to historical natural dye practices. Artist Melanie Monique Rose will share how she incorporates the search for natural colour into her art practice and will invite you to explore this magical and beautiful process. You will dye both cellulose (plant-derived) and protein (critter-derived) fibres. This introduction to natural dyeing is intended to ignite further exploration into the rainbow beneath our feet! You will finish this workshop with a hand-dyed shawl to take home or (if you are taking Day Two) you can felt onto your shawl!

Needles, Bowls & Beads - Felting with Wool - Day Two

This workshop introduces participants to two-dimensional needle felting and three-dimensional wet felting techniques. Artist Melanie Monique Rose will talk about the history of felting and how she uses this technique in her fibre art practice. Immerse yourself in the tactile and meditative process of felting. Participants will take home a bowl/basket, beads and needle felted artwork. If you have taken Day One, you may wish to use your dyed materials in this workshop!

In this down to earth class, you will learn how to use tarot as a tool for divination, guidance or selfreflection discussing the archetypes and symbols used to tell the story in the cards. There is no need to memorize the meanings of 78 cards: Susie will help break down the tarot system in a way that is easy to understand. This workshop is perfect for those new to tarot or those wanting to feel more comfortable reading the cards for themselves or others. You will be provided with lots of resources for further learning on your own as you continue on your tarot journey!

Students must have a tarot deck with traditional symbolism such as Rider-Waite-Smith, Thoth, Halloween Tarot, Robin-Wood Tarot etc. If you have questions about which Tarot deck to use, please contact the AGR, and we will put you in touch with Susie. DO NOT use an Angel Deck or Oracle Cards for this workshop!

ARTIST'S STATEMENT

I have always been intrigued by the human form. As a child and teen, I was continually drawing people. When I reached adulthood, I collected dolls, which then sparked an interest in doll making. Although I have long enjoyed the seemingly limitless options that the various doll media offer, I have ventured into sculpting the human figure in clay. This challenge inspires and excites me.

Almost everything I make tells a story. Never has this been more apparent than in my latest project, The Spirit Woods. The Spirit Woods is a modern faery tale about a woman who sustains a fall in the woods, which gives her the ability to observe another plane of existence. She records her experiences in a journal, which is the foundation for this project.

Taking paper as my primary medium, I worked it in a variety of ways - from stand-alone cut-outs to three-dimensional shadow collages. I digitally manipulated drawings and photographs to impart an

illustrated quality reminiscent of a children's storybook. Even the figurative sculptures are made from paper - a fine clay made from paper.

My intention in creating this body of work was to lift us out of our everyday reality and to allow us to rediscover our sense of childlike wonder. I suppose this is the part of me that refuses to grow up and for which I make no apology. MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

MAILY DOLATA

What ideas do you explore in your art?

I am trying to find a fresh and unique approach to the female portrait. I enjoy painting prairie landscapes and the agriculture scenes, attempting to capture the interplay between humans and nature. I explore the concept of time, painting the ephemeral beauty of sunflowers, dandelions, roses and poppies.

What mediums do you enjoy working with most and why?

I am fascinated by watercolour, especially when painting flowers because this medium offers a unique feel and texture. I prefer to use acrylic or oil for easier blending purposes to express the finesse of colour tones, especially when working on female portraits.

Tell us about some of your recent accomplishments!

My paintings have been receiving recognition at the local guilds' exhibitions for years. I am thankful to my group of fans that regularly buy and collect my art, and their recognition and support keeps me going on.

What art projects you are currently working on or plan to start in the future?

I have started a series of miniature female portraits in acrylic, with the themes revolving around women's experiences in life. Also, I will start, for the first time, a new body of work of mixed media portraits. I am excited to see how it will turn out.



MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

REY FRANCIS DOMINIC TATAD

What ideas do you explore in your art?

I explore the ideas of cultural identity, immigration and culture shock in relation to the experience of an immigrant community interwoven with history that binds our globalized world today. I examine the hegemony of the West and the legacies of colonialism in both Canada and the Philippines and how they profoundly impacted the nationhood of both countries. I also contextualize my own past and experiences as an immigrant myself in the grand scheme of things that further inform my work.

What media do you enjoy working with most and why?

I absolutely prefer using pencil crayons for my practice because I enjoy creating fine detail with dry media with finished work looking just as identical as to an oil painting. With detail-heavy work as my preference, it is satisfying to achieve realism through layering and burnishing colors unto the paper. I also chose pencil crayons because they were the first medium I indulged in among other media such as oils and acrylics.

Tell us about some of your recent accomplishments!

I had my graduation exhibition last year featuring the art that I wanted to make after having been used to making portraits and commissions. Although it was a virtual exhibition due to COVID-19, it was still fulfilling nonetheless. Before this, I had another exhibition at the student led gallery (Fifth Parallel) on campus last year so I have been building up my experience in having my art featured in exhibitions. I also managed to have my own personal style of art established that I wish to continue to build upon.

What projects you are currently working on or plan to start in the future?

I plan on striking a balance between getting as much art and exposure for my art done. I have also made submissions for a couple of art contests as well as building up my artist resume through joining exhibitions. So far, I am planning to create two to three large-scale drawings for the last two studio classes I need to take that will be consistent with the ideas I have established for my other works a year ago.
